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What is Parent Aide?

The Parent Aide Program is an in-home and community visitation and family support service that assists many families with children. This program consists of parent aides who teach parents to become more active, responsible and supportive to their children's needs.

What to Expect?

The Parent Aide

A great mentoring relationship between the Parent Aide and the family can provide the support and structure for healing from abuse and/or neglect. The Parent Aide will begin a lasting friendship and relationship that will:

- end the cycle of any abuse or neglect
- create a bond with the Parent(s)
- deescalate crisis situations
- help the parent(s) with community resources
- exemplify great parenting and life skills

Training/Requirements

Parent Aides are required to have a High School diploma, own transportation, complete First Aid/CPR, Mental Health First Aid, Bloodborne Pathogen Training, Behavioral Management, HIPAA and Parent Aide Orientation. Parent Aides meet with their families 5-15 hours per week based on family needs. Parent Aides will also meet with the Parent Aide Coordinator once per week to discuss the family's progress.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can be a part of Parent Aide?

All parents with children under the age of 18 can participate in the Parent Aide program. You must be interested in participating in any of the services that Parent Aide offers based upon your needs.

What will my Parent Aide do for me?

Your Parent Aide will provide support, guidance and be a positive role model. They will also assist you with the necessary services needed for your family.

How long will my aide work with me?

Your Parent Aide program is designed specifically for each family. The duration of services varies based upon your individual needs.

What can I do to achieve my goals?

In order to achieve your goals, you should always keep your appointments with your Parent Aide, be open to learn, be attentive, provide feedback, ask for help when needed and believe in yourself.
